ACADEMIC AWARDS

The following scholarships are based on a combination of academic performance, curriculum, standardized test scores (SAT/ACT), and co-curricular activities. Each student who is accepted is eligible to receive a merit-based scholarship and will be notified of their award shortly after admission. All Presidential Scholars will be selected by The Scholarship Committee.

- **Presidential Scholarship ***
Full Tuition. (\$34,830/year)
- **Vance Scholarship ***
\$84,000 (\$21,000/year)
- **Tower Scholarship**
\$78,000 (\$19,500/year)
- **Titan Scholarship**
\$70,000 (\$17,500/year)
- **Trustee Scholarship**
\$62,000 (\$15,500/year)

**Recipients are required to maintain a 3.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA) during their studies at Westminster College to have their award renewed each year.*

NOMINATED MERIT-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS

- **Young Presbyterian Scholarship**
\$76,000 (\$19,000 per academic year) To be eligible, a student must be a member of the Presbyterian Church USA, be nominated by his/her church and present a minimum GPA of 3.5.
- **Presbyterian Heritage Scholarship**
\$72,000 (\$18,000 per academic year) To be eligible, a student must be a member of a Presbyterian Church, be nominated by his/her church and present a minimum GPA of 3.5.
- **Jerb Miller Scholarship**
\$76,000 (\$19,000 per academic year) To be eligible, a student must be nominated by an educator who is a Westminster College graduate and present a minimum GPA of 3.5.
- **Legacy Scholarship**
\$74,000 (\$18,500 per academic year) To be eligible, a student must present a cumulative GPA of 3.0 and have a parent or grandparent who earned a degree from Westminster College.

OTHER SCHOLARSHIPS

- **Lemmon Family Scholarship**
Worth approximately \$140,000 the Lemmon Family Scholarship is a four year full-tuition scholarship for students enrolling in the pre-health program, renewable with the maintenance of a 3.4 cumulative GPA and satisfactory academic progress.
- **Music Talent Award**
Students with exceptional ability in music, who are music majors or minors, may receive a grant ranging from \$500 to \$2,000 for their participation. Interested students should contact the Department of Music to apply.

How do you know if you qualify for a merit-based scholarship? Complete an application for admission and submit it to the Office of Admissions.
